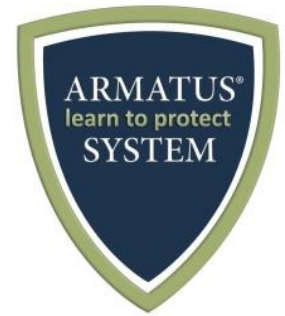


Guide for Program Directors to Register for Armatus® Online Training

The training is accessible anytime, from anywhere. Each course takes approximately 30-45 minutes to complete. All courses are available on Praesidium's Armatus Learn to Protect System, and some campuses offer select courses on their internal training systems.

<p>The California Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act ("CANRA") describes both your legal responsibilities and additional recommended steps regarding the identification and reporting of child abuse and neglect. You will learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Why reporting suspected abuse and neglect is critical • Who is a mandated reporter of suspected abuse and neglect • What types of conduct must be reported • What you must do if you are a mandated reporter • How to respond if a child discloses abuse or neglect to you 	<p>"A Day at Day Camp" takes you through a typical day at camp. You will learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How to keep campers safe from sexual abuse • How to protect yourself from false allegations of abuse • How to identify and manage high risk situations at camp • What to do if you see something suspicious or inappropriate

<p>Camping can be a wonderful experience for kids – but not if they are abused by a counselor or a peer. Teach them how to protect those you serve from abuse and themselves from false allegations. <p>Bullying, in some way, is a part of everybody's childhood memories. However, the severity of recent bullying incidents has shown that bullying can no longer be a "normal" part of growing up.</p> <p>Participants will learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What bullying is • How bullying happens • The impact of bullying • What you can do to stop bullying • What to do if you are a supervisor 	<p>It's hard to believe that anyone would hurt the elderly. Fortunately, federal and state laws and regulations help protect vulnerable adults from abuse.</p> <p>Participants will learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Facts about abuse and neglect • How to recognize risk factors, warning signs, and red-flag behaviors • Steps to take to keep residents safe • Steps to protect care givers from false allegations • Steps administrators can take to prevent abuse and neglect
<i>Preventing Abuse against Adults with Disabilities</i>	
<p>Providing care to people with disabilities is rewarding and challenging work. However, some caregivers psychologically abuse, physically abuse, steal from those they care for, and some even sexually abuse people in their care. You can do your part to make sure this doesn't happen!</p> <p>Participants will learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Facts about abuse of people with disabilities • Characteristics of potential victims • Awareness of potential abusers and high-risk environments • Steps to keep clients safe • How to prevent false allegations
